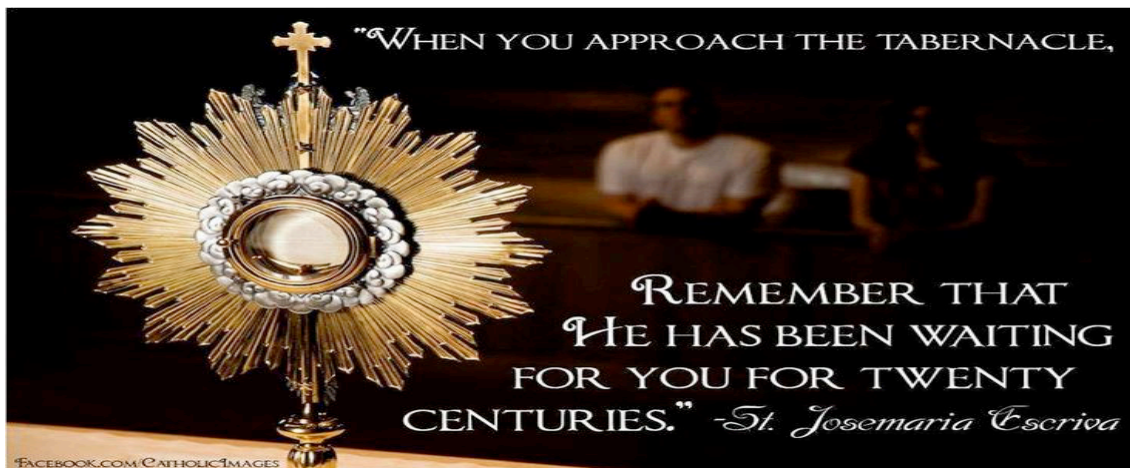

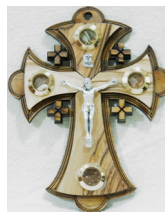

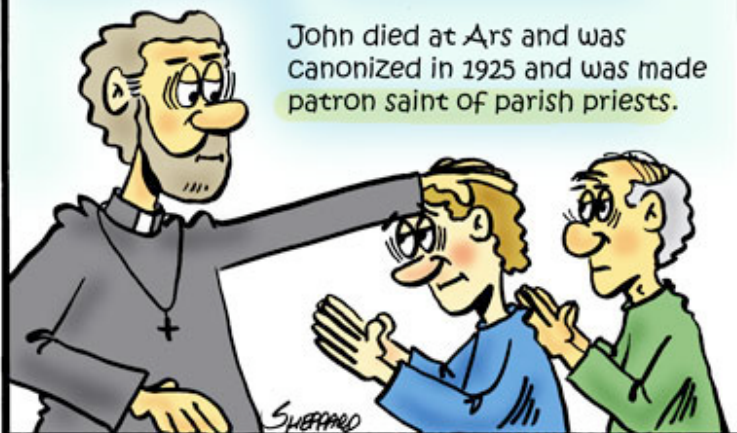

SAINTS FUN FACTS by John Sheppard

St John Baptist Vianney was born in France in 1786.
After being drafted into the Army, he deserted and
returned home and entered the seminary in 1813.

He was assigned to Ecully and in 1818 he became
Cure, as pastor of Ars. He worked 16 to 18 hours a
day working in the confessional, administering the
Sacrament of Penance, or Reconciliation.

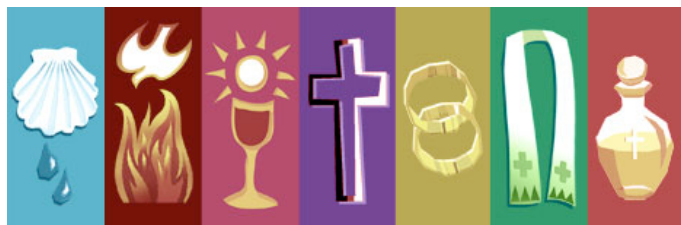
John died at Ars and was
canonized in 1925 and was made
patron saint of parish priests.
