Parish Mission Statement

Sacred Heart Church, Cambria Heights is a diverse, vibrant, family united in faith. Drawing from our rich cultural backgrounds, we proclaim Christ as Lord, celebrate His living presence in the Sacraments, and serve others in his name.

BAPTISM POLICY

Dear parishioners,

We want to celebrate the initiation of the infants of our families into the lifestyle of Christian discipleship in our catholic community of faith. Our secular society challenges us to become more aware of what it means to be a Catholic Christian today. It calls us to become clear about our identity as Catholic and as Christian. Those of you among us who would like to consider having your children baptized are asked to reflect upon the following:

1-Catholic Parents

Mother or father must be Catholic or preparing to become Catholic by participating in the sessions of the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA).

2-Choosing Godparents

Godparents must be practicing Catholics in order to witness to their god-child that they believe what the Catholic community of faith believes. They must be chosen by the parents, at least 16 years of age, already have received the sacraments of confirmation and Holy Communion. If married, they must be married according to the discipline and lifestyle of the Catholic Church. It is the responsibility of the godparents to support the parents in showing and teaching their god-child "the ways of the faith." Only a practicing Catholic can fulfill this responsibility in the Catholic Church.

3-Importance of a Christian name

So often in the recent past we have baptized children who have been named after athletes and figures from non-Christian religions. It is obvious that Christian heroes, heroines, and role models have not been considered. We ask you to consider carefully adding a Christian name to your child. Discover who our models of faith are and be proud of them as of any athlete.

4-Initial Contact

If you want to have your baby baptized, please call the rectory to set up an appointment for registration. On the day of the interview, bring the baby's birth certificate if possible.

5-Two Preparation Classes

Parents, you will have to attend 2 classes after the interview. The first class will be directed by team leaders. Godparents attend only the 2nd class. It is directed by team leaders and the presider of the baptism ceremony.

6-Presentation of the Newly Baptized

One week after the baptism, parents are invited to bring their newly baptized children to church in their baptism garment in order to be introduced to the faith community into which they have been baptized. Members of the baptism team will call the parents to remind them. The baptism certificates can be handed out on that day.

We look forward for a joyful baptismal celebration of your children!

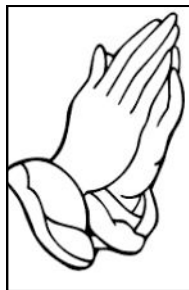

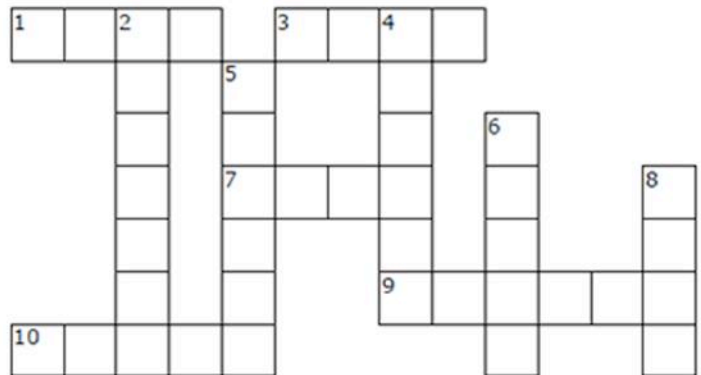
This puzzle is based on Luke 16:19-31
